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
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INTRODUCTION

FROM OUR CHAIR, JEREMY GREEN


2019-2020 HAS BEEN A MOMENTOUS YEAR FOR PRINCE'S TRUST AMERICA.

Our primary purpose is to support the charitable work of The Prince's Trust across the world; During our first year 2019-2020 Prince's Trust America has secured commitments totalling over \$8,500,000 through the incredible generosity of our patrons. These funds have been deployed through The Prince's Trust Group; in particular in the UK, Europe, Africa and Asia; helping young people succeed in their transition from education to employment.

Young people are facing one of the most turbulent times in living memory. The coronavirus pandemic has not only disrupted young people's futures, but our research shows it has also led to many abandoning their career hopes and ambitions. The pandemic has laid bare inequalities that threaten to push the most marginalized further to the edges of society, endangering the health and wellbeing of our communities.

For the first time in more than 100 years the current generation are in a worse financial position than the generation before them. Generational income growth has stalled and the changing nature of work, economic uncertainty and the impact of the COVID-19 public health crisis are all leading many young people to feel anxious and, on occasion, even hopeless about their futures.

Over the next year, as the full extent of the repercussions of COVID-19 become clear, The Trust will continue to work with government, employers, and communities to help tackle youth unemployment. Prince's Trust America is committed to continuing to build support in the United States and fund innovate methods to help young people succeed. We are dedicated to supporting young people through this crisis and give them hope for the future.



AKEME

2020 PRINCE'S TRUST GLOBAL AWARD WINNER

AKEME, 23, GREW UP IN FAIRY VALLEY IN THE SOUTH OF BARBADOS. His mum and dad both work in farming, his mum with horticulture, and his dad with animals. When he got to secondary school age Akeme started to skip class and meet up with his friends.

At a crossroads, a friend of his heard about the arrival of the Prince's Trust in Barbados and recommended it to Akeme. He saw it as an opportunity to get involved in something new on the island.

The Prince's Trust gave Akeme the confidence to believe in himself and he finally started to see that he had potential. After completing the personal development program delivered with the Royal Barbados Police Force, Akeme began to look for better opportunities.

Following his work placement, Akeme was offered a full-time job and, although it was not his dream career, he saw this as an opportunity to learn and the experience taught him to be diligent and hardworking. Akeme dreamed of being an entrepreneur, and as well as working at a restaurant on the island, he has set up his own hot sauce and catering company "Paradise Eats".

In March 2020 Akeme travelled to London to accept the Prince's Trust Global Award from HRH The Prince of Wales, as well as attending a dinner at Buckingham Palace. Akeme's story was featured by CNN International to households around the world.

Akeme has since enrolled in the "Enterprise Program" with the Barbados Youth Business Trust to develop more skills to further his business.



THE YOUNG PEOPLE WE SUPPORT



These include young people disengaged from their education due to personal pressures; those willing, able and ready to enter the workplace but who face challenges in accessing entry level positions; and young people, who have dreams of running their own business but who lack the training and knowledge to succeed.

ERINI'S STORY

GREECE

After graduating, Eirini could not get hired for what she went to school for. Like many young Greeks, she was forced to look for a job where she could find it, even though her qualifications lay elsewhere. Exhausted from so many days finishing in the early hours, and from trying to keep up with her university work, Eirini joined the Prince's Trust employability program.

Following the program, Eirini was offered a job at Vodafone and six months down the

line she tells us that she has learned so much about herself and plans to have a long-term career with the company. She has even been offered a promotion after 6 months from Sales Advisor to Internet Specialist.

"Ultimately, I'd like to become a trainer so that I can show people like me that when you have determination, you can make anything happen."

NATALIE'S STORY

SCOTLAND

"For the last seven years, I have been a stay at home mum and my mother's carer. My last job was in a bar and I didn't have any work experience apart from that. I was applying for anything going - bar work, cleaning jobs - but I just didn't hear anything back.

"My brother told me about The Prince's Trust. He had been on one of their programs several years ago and said it would boost my confidence and help me get some work experience under my belt. I got in touch and was offered a place on a Get into Social Care course.

"There was so much to take in during the five weeks. I learned about health and safety, first aid, moving and assisting, and child protection. We completed one course a day, sometimes two, and were mentored throughout to learn about what working in care was really like. After finishing training and gaining some basic qualifications, I took part in a work placement at a care home near my hometown.

"The program finished on my birthday. We had a celebration event and an interview for a permanent role with Cornerstone. I found out the next day that I had been successful.

"Now I work full-time in adult social care. Getting back into learning in a hands-on way helped me so much, and I'm excited to progress in my career."

FINANCIAL REVIEW

PRINCE'S TRUST AMERICA had actual income for the year of \$8,563,689 and expenditure of \$6,400,422 resulting in an operating surplus for the year of \$2,163,267. Of these reserves \$1,915,085 is restricted to delivery due to take place in future years. The free reserves are therefore \$248,182.

Actual expenditure for 2019/20 was slightly lower than planned, due to the impact of COVID-19 from March 2020 onwards – in particular, the postponement of the Prince's Trust America Gala to 2021. Given that March 2020 was the final month of the financial year 2019/20, the outbreak of COVID-19 had little impact on actual income for 2019/20. Overall, the impact of COVID-19 resulted in a slightly higher operating surplus than had been anticipated.

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PRINCE'S TRUST YOUTH CENTERS, UK | \$3.2 MILLION The Prince's Trust operates 16 youth centers across the UK, where unemployed young people are able to attend training and mentoring sessions. This funding enabled The Prince's Trust to open its newest youth center in South London in December 2019. The other 15 centers are in cities such as Belfast, Glasgow, Cardiff, Liverpool, Manchester and Birmingham.



HEALTHCARE PARTNERSHIP IN SCOTLAND | \$855,000 The Prince's Trust has established a major partnership with the National Health Service and various social care providers, to support unemployed young people into healthcare jobs. This funding helped The Trust to support 177 young Scots to explore the health and social care sector during 2019/20 and helped hundreds more young people to engage with The Prince's Trust's wider youth programs in Glasgow.



ARTS-BASED PROGRAMS, UK | \$309,000

The Prince's Trust engages young people through the arts, including photography, theatre, fashion, film and music. The medium of the arts often also has a therapeutic benefit in helping some of the most vulnerable young people we work with to address challenges in their lives more comfortably with our youth workers. This funding helped The Trust to support 200 young people through a series of arts-based activities in the UK.



PRINCE'S TRUST DELIVERY IN GREECE | \$1.3 MILLION
This funding enabled Prince's Trust International to increase its
delivery in Greece, in particular supporting unemployed young people
in Athens and Crete with their employability and enterprise skills. PTI
supported 300 young people in Greece during 2019/20 and plans to
support a further 850 youth during 2020/21.



YOUTH PROGRAMS IN SOUTHERN ENGLAND | \$382,000 The Prince's Trust supports thousands of young people per year in the South of England. This funding has enabled The Trust to support hundreds of young people in cities such as Southampton and Portsmouth, by helping them to develop their confidence, employability and enterprise skills.



SUPPORTING YOUNG LONDONERS

This center, designed by young people, for young people across London, is an amazing space to come to gain confidence, skills and motivation for the future.

Due to the pandemic, the center was shut for several months but is now open for some programs and services, continuing to support young people in person

Dame Martina is Group Chief Executive of The Prince's Trust and was previously Chief Executive of The Prince's Trust in the UK. She joined The Prince's Trust in May 2004, having been Chief Executive of the BBC Children in Need Appeal since 2000. Martina trained and began her career as a journalist. She established the Press and Communications function for the Catholic Fund for Overseas Development (CAFOD). She then held the post of Chief Executive of the Association of Spinal Injury Research, Rehabilitation and Reintegration (ASPIRE). Dame Martina received a CBE for services to charity in 2013. In the 2017 New Year Honours list, she received the honour of Dame Commander of the Royal Victorian Order (DCVO).

ROMERO BRITTO

Romero is an international artist known for his vibrant work, which has been exhibited in galleries and museums in over 100 countries, including the Carrousel de Louvre and Museo Soumaya. He has created public art installations for the O2 Dome in Berlin, New York's John F. Kennedy Airport, Cirque Du Soleil at Super Bowl XLI, and has been credited with the largest monumental sculpture in London's Hyde Park history. He has also collaborated with international brands such as Audi, Bentley, Coca-Cola, Walt Disney, Evian, Hasbro, Hublot, and Universal Pictures. Romero has donated time, art, and resources to more than 250 charitable organizations. He holds a seat on several boards including The Best Buddies International and St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. Romero is committed to developing and supporting the role art will continue to play in world issues.
